#### Our Themes for This half Term

This autumn, we have a host of wonderful themes lined up

#### "All About Us"

For the first part of this half term while the children settle into their new classes with new teachers, we will be learning all about us, our families and home. It is a great time to talk about what we like and don't like.

Children will explore their unique identities and the importance of family and community. You may like to send in a picture of your family for us to display. This will give the children a topic of conversation as well as a source of comfort in the first few weeks.

#### Autumn

Autumn is a great time of year to learn about changes and explore different aspects of the natural world.



This season will also celebrate:

#### Harvest Time

The Harvest Festival occurs on the Sunday nearest to the appearance of the harvest moon, which is usually at the end of September or the beginning of November. The traditional start of the autumn season, the Harvest Festival in 2024 is due to take place on the 6th October.

During this theme the children will be learning lots of new skills: counting and sorting food items, using physical skills to chop and cut up fruit and vegetables. Plant seasonal vegetables in the garden and watch them grow. We will explore the colours of different foods, sample foods from different cultures. Harvest

Festival is usually a time to share locally grown produce with those in need so we will encourage children to bring some food items from home to share among the local community

#### Snack time

Meal times are an important part of the busy bee routine. Children learn important skills:

- Hygiene (through handwashing)
- Self help and independence
- Making healthy choices (what they would like to eat or drink)
- Physical skills as they prepare their food, use utensils and pour their own drinks
- Manners saying please and thank you as well as learning to sit nicely while eating
- Learn about different cultures through sampling food

#### Donation of snack items

Busy bees are always grateful for the generous donations of snack items. We will be encouraging this more now than we ever have. You can help us ensure children are getting their daily portions of fruit and vegetables by donating these items weekly in the donation Station basket which will be under the shelter in the garden at drop off time. #### Toilet training

Many of you have begun potty training recently and have been asking for advice on the best way to do this at home. The biggest challenge is learning Bowel control and often what puts parents off potty training or going back to using a nappy. However, all is not lost!!!

For children going to school next year, it is important that they have mastered the art of using the toilet independently. We will support parents with toilet training at preschool however, you must be confident that your child is using the toilet and understanding their toileting urges at home first

#### Coats and outdoor footwear

We play outside every day in all weathers. As the weather will begin to change, we will see some wet and cold days ahead. Please ensure your child brings a warm waterproof coat and wellie boots (if is raining). You might like to send in some warm comfortable slippers for indoor play.

We often find that children who arrive in cars or buggies have no outdoor clothing and cannot enjoy the outside fun so easily.

#### Everything must be named!!!!!

We have a lot of children and as you can imagine trying to make sure they all go home with the correct belongings is a huge task at the end of the session! Children also get muddles when clothing are the same colour or design as theirs. We ask that you name **all** of their clothing, coats, bags, lunchboxes, bottles etc. This way we can try to make sure the right things go home. Also please make sure your child leaves with the correct items. If they do accidently take something home that isn't theirs please return it back to their class to be reunited with the right child.
